Local Independence Day Events

Cape St. Claire Parade - July 4th 10:00 am (Cape St. Claire Fire Hall to the Main Beach)

Annapolis Parade - July 4th 6:30 pm (Amos Garrett Blvd., right on West Street, around Church Circle, down Main Street, left on Randall Street, and ends in front of the Market House).

Annapolis Fireworks - At approximately 9:15 p.m., the fireworks will be launched from a barge in Annapolis Harbor. The best viewing areas include public spaces Northeast of the Severn River, along the Naval Academy Bridge (limited parking area), any of the street-end parks facing Spa Creek, and aboard a boat in the Annapolis harbor. The Spa Creek Bridge will be closed to traffic beginning at 9 p.m. to create a spectator pier with an unobstructed view of the fireworks. (Parking restrictions from about 4:30 to 10:30 pm.)

Severna Park Parade - July 4th 10:00 am (Benfield and Evergreen Roads to downtown Severna Park).



Expecting Visitors? Having Company? Be Considerate of Your Neighbors.

If you are expecting visitors (relatives, friends or a plumber, electrician, etc.), please instruct your visitor to not park in any designated (numbered) parking space other than your own. Don't assume that they already know this because often they don't. To avoid confusion, you could (ahead of time): either (1) move YOUR vehicle to an available parking space along a curb (but NOT a yellow curb or fire lane) to allow your visitor closer access to your home, (2) ask permission of your neighbor if your visitor may temporarily park in their parking space while they are at work, if applicable, or (3) ask your visitor to park in a Visitor Parking space if one is available. Under no circumstances should your visitor park in another designated (numbered) parking space nor should they "double park" behind your vehicle(s). In the unfortunate circumstance that an emergency vehicle needs to access your street, double parking or parking along a yellow curb or in a fire lane could delay their access.

Safer Alternatives to Hazardous Products for Use in Your Home			
Cleaning use	Alternative		
Ammonia-based cleaners	Vinegar, salt and water mixture for surface cleaning. Baking soda and water for the bathroom.		
Abrasive cleaners	Rub area with one-half lemon dipped in borax, then rinse.		
Floor or furniture polish	1 part lemon juice, 2 parts olive or vegetable oil.		
Silver polishes	Soak in boiling water with baking soda, salt, a piece of aluminum.		
Toilet cleaners	Baking soda, toilet brush.		
Disinfectants	One-half cup borax in 1 gallon water.		
Drain cleaners	Plunger; flush with boiling water, one-quarter cup baking soda, one-quarter cup vinegar.		
Rug/upholstery cleaners	Dry cornstarch sprinkled on, then vacuumed.		
Water softener	One-quarter cup vinegar in final rinse.		
Oil stains	White chalk rubbed into stain before laundering.		
Glass cleaner	White vinegar and water or rubbing alcohol and water.		
Copper cleaner	Paste of lemon juice, salt and flour or, rub on tomato paste, rinse off and buff.		
Abrasive cleaners	Baking soda		
Stainless steel polish	Baking soda or mineral oil for shining, vinegar to remove spots.		
Stain Remover	Vinegar		
Mildew remover	Lemon juice and salt or white vinegar and salt.		

Those Pesky Mosquito Bites!

There has been a lot in the news lately about mosquitoes and what you can do to help control their breeding around your home. But, if you're out and about, here are a few tips to avoid being bitten:



- Wear long pants, long-sleeve shirt and hat when outdoors.
- Use mosquito repellents containing DEET. Consult a physician before applying DEET to young children.
- Avoid areas of high mosquito infestation.
- Restrict the outdoor play of your children if mosquitoes are present.
- Avoid unnecessary outdoor activities at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active.
- Drain all water-holding outdoor containers around the home.
- Inspect basements and crawl spaces. If they are flooded, drain as quickly as possible.
- The very young, the elderly and persons with depressed immune systems are at most risk for acquiring disease from mosquito bites.
