### A Word from the President

As the Fall season rapidly approaches, I would like to take a moment to remind residents to complete needed repairs of your individual townhomes. The anticipated weather conditions for this period should be favorable for exterior work, as well as regular lawn cutting/maintenance. Please be reminded that consistent upkeep of your townhome is not only a wise investment of your resources of time and money, but also part of your contract agreement per community covenants when purchasing a home in Walnut Ridge.

As a managed community, we have experienced a relatively successful year maintaining our roads, sidewalks, trees, landscaping, and common areas. The one exception that comes to mind deals specifically with our inability to remove snow in a timely fashion following a sudden and record accumulation that took place early this year. Nearly all localities experienced the same difficulties due to the unrelenting snowfall and overtaxed plowing resources. Our new contractor at the time was initially overwhelmed, as were most similar businesses in the surrounding area. Following a requested meeting with the Board, Level Green Landscaping feels confident that the next significant event (should it occur) will be met with a more proactive and productive response. In regard to the response displayed by many of my fellow neighbors, I would like to convey an expression of gratitude and pride concerning impromptu acts of kindness and assistance in clearing the roads and parking spaces by hand as weather permitted. It is a wonderful thing to be reminded that we are surrounded by such good people.

In closing, I would like to share an observation on the unprecedented presidential campaigning to which we continue to witness. To

### **Treasurer's Report**

opportunity to communicate about Walnut Ridge's cash flow and the budget that we are preparing for 2017. As you know we have had a couple of tough snow years that have depleted our operating cash. There were several tree and ground maintenance issues in 2016 that we had not planned for. It also just came to light that Walnut Ridge is liable for the new Stormwater Remediation Fee. Our cash is within the safety zone but it is unlikely that these issues will go away any time soon. For these reasons the board is finding that it will need to increase assessments by 5-10% in the new year.

I want to express to everyone that we use these funds to maintain and improve property values at Walnut Ridge. It is my fiduciary duty as Treasurer to work with the board and our management company to create a budget that will cause the least financial hardship on the unit owners in the short term, but also pave the way for us to meet our long term goals. The board does not take increases to assessments lightly. We hope that you understand and we invite to you come to board meetings to familiarize yourselves with the operations of Walnut Ridge.

### Architectural & Environmental (A&E) Standards

Whether you are new to Walnut Ridge or are a long-time resident, please remember that virtually all exterior changes which affect the physical appearance of your home, **require Board approval**. Each separate exterior change also requires Board approval. This includes, but is not limited to: windows, roofs, fences, sheds and solar panels.

An Application for Exterior Alteration, Addition or New Construction (also known as an "A&E App" or "ACC App") **MUST** be completed and submitted to the Board for review and approval **BEFORE** your work begins. You can find the Application on our website at **www.walnutridgeonline.org** 

### Siding, Trim and Roof Color Requirements

If you are staining/painting the outside of your home, staining/painting a deck or replacing a roof, remember to use the colors as required by the Association's Architectural and Environmental Standards:

- Siding: Siding must be painted using acrylic, solid body stain. The color must match "Solid Cedar." This color is available in many brands and sold by several local dealers.
- Trim: Trim (to include gutters, downspouts, and the attached shed doors) must be painted using an exterior acrylic semi-gloss white material.
- Fences: If fences or screening are stained, they must be stained the same color as the townhome ("Solid Cedar")
- Roof: Roof shingles must be the color "Autumn Brown." GAF Royal Sovereign and Owings Corning both make "Autumn Brown" color shingles.

If you have any questions about any exterior requirements, please contact the Board of Directors or the Association's management company, ProCom.

### School Bus Safety

Since school is back in session, there has been a lot in the news lately about school bus safety. Please share with your children these tips from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration:



- Get to the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- When the bus approaches, stand at least 6 feet away from the curb, and line up away from the street.
- Wait until the bus stops, the door opens, and the driver says that it's okay before stepping onto the bus.
- If you have to cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the sidewalk or along the side of the road to a point at least 10 feet ahead of the bus before you cross. Be sure that the bus driver can see you, and you can see the bus driver.
- Use the handrails to avoid falls. When exiting the bus, be careful that clothing or backpacks don't get caught in the handrails or doors.
- Never walk behind the bus.
- If you drop something near the bus, tell the bus driver. Never try to pick it up because the driver may not be able to see you.


### A Word From The Walnut Ridge Wanderer
