Interesting Maryland Facts


 The United States Naval Academy was founded on October 10, 1845 at Annapolis.



- King William's School (now St. John's College) opened in 1696 and was the first school in the United States.
- The first dental college, Baltimore College of Dental Surgery, opened in Baltimore in 1840.
- Maryland State House is the oldest state capitol still in continuous legislative use dating back to 1772.
- Friendship International Airport now Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport began operations on June 24. 1950.

School Bus Safety - Attention Drivers!

- When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.
- When driving in neighborhoods with school zones, watch out for young people who may be thinking about getting to school, but may not be thinking about getting there safely.
- Slow down. Watch for children walking in the street, especially if there are no sidewalks in the neighborhood.
- Watch for children playing and congregating near bus stops.
- Be alert. Children arriving late for the bus may dart into the street without looking for traffic.
- Learn and obey the "alternately flashing warning light" system that school bus drivers use to alert motorists.
 - 1. Yellow flashing lights indicate that the bus is preparing to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop vehicles.
 - 2. Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped, and that children are getting on or off. Motorists approaching from either direction must wait until the red lights stop flashing before proceeding

Broadneck Peninsula Trail Update

On May 9, 2018, groundbreaking took place for the Broadneck Peninsula Trail Phase II which will run from Cape St. Claire to Arnold. This section will extend from Green Holly Drive to Bay Dale Drive. It was preceded by a trail constructed from Green Holly Drive to College Parkway East. The third phase is currently budgeted for design in the upcoming budget and construction the year after. Another phase (1B) is currently being studied to connect College Parkway East to Bay Head Park. When completed, the project will provide a paved multi-use trail running from the B & A Trail to Sandy Point State Park.

REMINDER:

NO PARKING IS ALLOWED IN THE CUL-DE-SAC

Several "NO PARKING" signs are posted around the Walnut Ridge Road cul-de-sac. This No Park-

ing regulation is being violated on a regular basis. Vehicles parked in the cul-de-sac reduce or obstruct the turnaround area available for some vehicles, most importantly emergency vehicles, such as fire trucks. These larger vehicles may not be able to negotiate the cul-de-



sac or access Tanook, Peach or Hazel Nut Courts if vehicles are parked in the cul-de-sac. Please be reminded that the "No Parking" regulation will be strictly enforced by the Anne Arundel County Police. Those in violation could be ticketed, towed or both.
