A Word From The President

Spring is right around the corner and the daffodils, forsythia and trees all have begun to bud and bloom. We experienced a relatively mild winter and now we can look forward to the warm weather. Spring brings with it a fresh start and a rejuvenation of hope. As we enter into this season, we ask that you to please be mindful of the following.

As for the Covid-19 or Coronavirus pandemic - PLEASE TAKE ALL personal, necessary, and advised precautions regarding the recently declared National Emergency. I believe our local, state, federal government, and medical professionals are on top of this threat. With the policy of containment to further prevent the spread, testing of suspected cases of infection, and treatment of confirmed cases, our society will prevail.

There continue to be a few people in our community that habitually fail or refuse to pick up and dispose of their dog's waste. In particular, this has been occurring all along the south side of Walnut Ridge Drive. It has been commented on in countless communications, complained about to Board members, and picked up and disposed of several times by a few individuals to slow the buildup. This practice of not cleaning up after your dog is particularly annoying when the waste is not even 10 feet from a waste station that has a container and bags. If you see this being done, please say something to that dog walker. If you are the dog owner or walker committing this, please start acting responsibly and pick up and dispose of it. This is a high density neighborhood with people that deserve the ability to walk without the fear of stepping in dog droppings or be fouled with the rank smell of it.

I think most of us are doing a better job of placing our garbage out for pick up in sealed containers. However, there are those that still don't seem to have gotten the message. Garbage stored or put out for collection in bags is almost immediately set upon, torn open, partially eaten, and spread about by wild animals, rats, and large birds such as

vultures and crows. Additionally, wind blown trash from compromised bags is then strewn everywhere. Is this really the kind of community appearance we want? Most of us will answer with an emphatic "NO!" Also, many residents continue to leave their CONTAINERS in PLAIN SITE of the FRONT of their home OR OUTSIDE of their fenced or unfenced PROPERTY LINE in the rear. Many are not removing their empty containers in a timely manner following pick up. These are clear violations of our Community Guidelines and will not be tolerated by the Board of Directors or the management company. C'mon people! Let's ALL do our parts to make our community LOOK and FEEL attractive and pleasant! As part of that effort, the Board of Directors has decided to require your containers to be marked with indelible ink (like a "Magic Marker" or "Sharpie") with your house number.

Once the current threat of viral pandemic has subsided and "social distancing" becomes just a memory, you may notice additional parking restrictions along some of our community-owned curbs. These areas have been problematic in the past due to their narrow nature. When used by residents for parking excess vehicles, it makes it difficult for entering and exiting marked parking spaces and further restricts access by emergency vehicles.

Finally - on a more pleasant note, the Board is now postured to order the necessary materials and renovate the community playground. Our goal is to have work completed and open for use by May 4th or sooner. I'm certain the renewed facility will be welcomed and well attended by the SUPERVISED children of our community.

The U.S. Department of Transportation's (USDOT) National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is mobilizing law enforcement officers nationwide to look out for drivers texting or using their cell phone behind the wheel.

- Turn off electronic devices and put them out of reach before starting to drive.

- Speak up when you are a passenger and your driver uses an electronic device while driving.
