A Final Word From the President-2019

Greetings to all! Our Annual Meeting on November 14th took place with the required quorum and we welcome the new membership of Janice Hariadi and Kelly Miller to the Board of Directors. This was a busy year for the Board, with a number of projects worthy of note. The milling and paving of our privately owned and maintained roadways was an ambitious undertaking and could not have been accomplished without the cooperation and patience of our residents. Repaving of Walnut Ridge Drive will hopefully be done by the DPW of AACo next year. The dead and dying Photinia trees on the East side of the Tot Lot have been removed, providing a much improved appearance for that area. The restoration of the Cat Branch Stream has been largely completed through funding and management by AACo. Annual 3rd party inspections have been performed along with non-compliance letters sent.

Future Board initiatives for the coming year include much needed maintenance/improvement to our community Tot Lot. BGE has been approached with an upgrade request for our Private Area Lighting (PAL) light poles. Increased attention will focused on our community plantings and tree replacement, as well.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to thank all of you for your continued patience and understanding while dealing with any perceived inconveniences you may have suffered through this last year. At the same time, I find it worth noting that there are a few

(A Final Word from the President continued from page 1) residents that seem to ignore some very basic "rules of the road" in Walnut Ridge. Specifically, there are four issues that immediately come to mind:

- 1. Disposing of your pet's waste properly and in containers placed throughout the community is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT! Please!
- 2. If your residence includes more than two vehicles, those additional vehicles must not be parked on our private roads. We simply do not have the parking spaces to accommodate them. Those residents that continue to ignore this policy guideline will certainly be towed to an impoundment lot. Please cease this practice.
- 3. Please place your garbage and recycling containers out for collection no earlier than the evening before scheduled pickup. Please remove the emptied containers immediately following (as in same day) of pickup. Please, Please, Please do not leave garbage out for pickup in anything other than a covered garbage can. No Plastic Bags! And finally, please store your containers behind your home, on your property, and not on the common grounds of the community.
- 4. Any intended alteration to the exterior of your home must be preceded by an ACC Request directed to the Professional Community Management, Inc. and approved by the Association's Board of Directors.

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

- At the Annual Meeting on held on Thursday, November 14, 2019 at Broadneck Library, all Board members were re-elected to another term. Janice Hariadi and Kelly Miller were elected as Members at Large.
- Budget: The Board voted to approve the 2020 Budget. The 2020 Budget provides for a 5% increase in assessments to \$191 per quarter.
- The Board received and reviewed approximately 10 A&E requests since the Fall 2019 newsletter publication.
- Re-Inspections for exterior properties were conducted in the month of November by CIS. Homes continuing in non-compliance as initially cited will receive a second notice.
- The Board is reviewing 3 proposals for playground repairs/enhancements and the repairs are planned to take place in the spring.
- Snow removal contract was renewed with Level Green Landscaping.
- After the road improvements were made this summer, an updated reserve study is being considered.

Association Assessment Increase

Homeowners' Association assessments will increase to \$191 per quarter beginning January 1, 2020 and will be reflected in your 2020 coupon book. Assessments have not been increased since January 2017. The new assessment amount of \$191 per quarter is roughly a 5% increase from the current assessment. This increase is necessary in order to boost our reserve funds and to keep up with rising costs.

The assessments that are paid by every homeowner in Walnut Ridge are used for the common area upkeep (grass cutting, tree trimming, liability insurance, street lighting, sidewalk repairs, etc.), association administrative services such as accountant services, legal fees, property management fees and other miscellaneous expenses.

As a reminder, assessments are due on the 1st day of each quarter (January 1st, April 1st, July 1st and October 1st and are considered late if received after the 15th of the month it is due. If payment is made by check or automatic bill pay, please be sure that your payment is adjusted to new the 2020 assessment amount. If paying by check, make check payable to "Walnut Ridge Community Association" and send to:

About Front Foot Assessment Invoices

Some homeowners whose front foot benefit assessment is not yet paid off, will be receiving (or have already received) their front foot benefit assessment bill from either J & W Utilities or Old Line Utility, LLC. These assessments, which are paid for 33 years in accordance with a Deed and Agreement made between Arundel Union Enterprises (the developer) and either Old Line Utility LLC (successor to CLT Utilities) or J&W Utilities, Inc., are to pay back the developer for the costs incurred by the developer (not the Association) for the installation of water and sewer lines in our community. For some properties, this assessment may be already paid off. Be reminded that, you, as the homeowner, are responsible for this yearly invoice until the expiration of 33 years in accordance with the Deed and Agreement. Note, this is not a bill for quarterly water usage nor is it part of your quarterly assessments paid to Walnut Ridge Community Association, Inc.

This messy feast could easily have been avoided! Do not place your trash out in plastic bags! You will likely have to go out later and clean it up (we hope that you would not expect your neighbors to clean it up for you). Residents: place your trash out in an appropriate waste container!



Suggested waste containers (also known as trash cans, trash barrels, garbage cans, refuse bins, just to name a few) should be made of metal or plastic and have a snug fitting a lid.

And as a reminder - Trash and recycling containers should only be placed in the parking lot in front of your home and not in front of another's home - nor in any common area nor at the mailbox stations.

Tips for Recycling Your NATURAL Christmas Tree from the Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works

- * Natural garland, wreaths, and Christmas trees are yard waste. They are chipped into mulch, a valuable soil covering.
- * Please remove tree stand, bags, metal ornament hangers, and all decorations. Cut very tall trees in half so that the tree will fit into the contractor's truck.
- * Natural garland, wreaths, and Christmas trees will be collected on your collection day.
- * Yard waste is collected at the curb on your collection day all year round.
- * Put your natural garland, wreaths, and Christmas trees at the curb before 6:00 AM on your collection day or bring your items to any one of Anne Arundel County Recycling Centers.



Snow accumulating 3 inches or more on our private roads (Almond, Hazel Nut, Peach and Tanook) will be removed and salt applied to the roads (when necessary) by the Association's contracted snow removal company.



The County Public Works Department is responsible for removing snow on Walnut Ridge Drive, which is a County-owned road.

Reminder About Fireworks

As a reminder, the discharging of most fireworks are not allowed in Walnut Ridge.

- * When shoveling your sidewalk and parking spaces, do not throw or place your shoveled snow around the mailboxes. The mail carrier must be able to get to the mailboxes, otherwise, mail will not get delivered.
- * Please do not place large amounts of snow in the street, unless active plowing is taking place.
- * Keep your snow to yourself. Don't toss the snow into your neighbor's parking space or walkway, even if it means you have to carry the


A Word From The Walnut Ridge Wanderer
